## PRESENTATION TYPES

#### 1. ORAL CONCURRENT PRESENTATION

#### **ABOUT**

As the main content of the conference program, oral presentations will be grouped by themes where each presenter will be allocated 10 minutes for presentation. A 20-minute panel discussion with all speakers will follow the presentations where audience members will be invited to ask questions.

#### PRESENTATION-SPECIFIC GUIDELINES

Abstracts will be reviewed according to one of the following categories to ensure diversity of perspectives across the conference themes:

- Research: report on original research, including reviews of original research (e.g., systematic reviews, scoping reviews). Presentations within this category should include conventional elements such as background, aim, methods, results, conclusions, and implications.
- **Practice:** report on innovations in practice while challenging or informing on novel approaches in research and practice.
- **Lived experience:** report on perspectives from community members to discuss topics that need to be addressed with respect to multicultural health and wellbeing, and provide new perspectives to inform practice, policy and research.
- **Thought-provoking ideas:** report on ideas that challenge established practices or beliefs, with each presentation providing evidence and a clear future directions and considerations for research, practice or policy.





#### 2. SYMPOSIA

#### **ABOUT**

Offered as concurrent sessions, the symposia will allow a group of up to 4 speakers from diverse research and practice groups to engage in a set of related research and/or case studies on a particular topic relevant to the conference theme. The symposium will be allocated 45 to 60 minutes

The PRIMARY SPEAKER must submit the abstract. If there are multiple speakers, please upload their abstracts and supporting documentation as part of the ONE SUBMISSION. The reviewer will assess the abstract as ONE submission.

#### PRESENTATION-SPECIFIC GUIDELINES

A speaker from each group will need to submit an outline, which would include:

- Introduction and background
- Purpose or aim
- Overview of activities conducted (presentations, presentation styles, etc.)
- Expected learning outcomes for the audience

#### 3. WORKSHOP

#### **ABOUT**

Offered as concurrent sessions, the workshops will allow a group of speakers to present on a topic in a structured way that focuses on practical solutions through collaborative activities and discussions. The workshop will be allocated 45 to 60 minutes.

The LEAD SPEAKER will submit an abstract, details regarding the activities undertaken during the workshop and expected outcomes. Upload supporting documentation in the ONE SUBMISSION.

#### **Presentation-specific guidelines**

A speaker from each group will need to submit an outline which would include:

- Introduction and background
- Purpose or aim
- Overview of activities conducted (presentations, presentation styles, etc.)
- Expected learning outcomes for the audience





#### 4. POSTER

#### **ABOUT**

Posters will provide a visual display of innovative ideas, novel discoveries in research, practice, and policy. Posters will be displayed for the duration of the conference. The poster's format (digital or print) has yet to be determined. (Subject to change). At the next stage, accepted authors will be advised.

Refer to the abstract submission guidelines for content.

#### GENERAL ABSTRACT SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Abstracts will be reviewed after the closing date and the Abstract Review Committee will decide which abstracts will be selected for each presentation type. Please note that selected presentation types upon submission are preferences only and may be subject to change.

For original research and other submissions that involve case studies or evidence, abstracts must contain information addressing these areas:

- Background
- Methods
- Results
- Conclusion
- Implications

The above structure may not be strictly adhered to if a submission is a non-scientific/research abstract. In this case, provide:

- Overview of the problem
- Why is it a problem?
- Main discussion topics
- Implications
- Recommendations

The word limit for each abstract submitted is 300 words.

Do not add any references to abstracts.





# ABSTRACT REVIEW CRITERIA

The review criteria will be divided into four sections:

- 1. Alignment with conference objectives and outcomes
- 2. Relevance to health promotion and public health
- 3. Originality in content
- 4. Clarity of the abstract and adherence to the abstract guidelines
- 5. Potential relevance and impact on improving and informing multicultural health and wellbeing to address health inequities
- 6. Geographical, cultural and linguistic representation





#### HOW TO SUBMIT AN ABSTRACT USING THE PORTAL

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- You are not able to complete your Abstract until you have answered all mandatory questions.
- The submission form will ask you if your abstract is ready for review. If it is not, you can still submit and edit it. You will be sent an email with access to your account. The organising team will follow up with you to ensure your submission is ready for review before the due date.
- Abstracts will be reviewed after the closing date, and the Abstract Review Committee will decide which abstracts will be selected for each presentation type. Please note that selected presentation types upon submission are preferences only and may be subject to change.
- ➤ Acceptance Advice Issued to Authors will take place on Tuesday, 12 August 2025. The exact date is to be determined.

Abstract submissions will only be accepted via the online portal.

#### **Steps**

#### Presenter's Headshot

Provide a headshot.

#### **Presenter's Biography**

Provide a short 50-word biography.

#### Short description\*

Please provide a 50-word description outlining your Abstract.

#### Step 2B. Add Abstract Content

Please type in 'Title Case'. If you have acronyms, ensure these are CAPITALISED. The abstract is structured as follows:

DO NOT include your PAPER TITLE or AUTHORS in your abstract. HEADINGS must be included in BOLD followed by your text.





For original research and other submissions that involve case studies or evidence, abstracts must contain information addressing these areas:

- o Background
- o Methods
- o Results
- o Conclusion
- o Implications

The above structure may not be strictly adhered to if a submission is a non-scientific/research abstract. In this case, provide:

- o Overview of the problem
- o Why it's a problem?
- o Main discussion topics
- o Implications
- o Recommendations

The word limit for each abstract submitted is 300 words. Do not add any references to abstracts.







# **HOW TO EDIT YOUR SUBMISSION**

Head to your email inbox and find a confirmation email from the *National Multicultural Health* and *Wellbeing Conference 2025 - Fourwaves*. It may fall into your junk/spam mail. Please ensure any emails coming from Fourwaves appear in your primary inbox to ensure you do not miss out on any information.

- 1. Scroll down to the 'Access my account' button.

- Select the Submissions tab (second tab) and select your paper.




4. On the right-hand side, click the **Edit Submission** button.
